The Traverse is today delighted to announce three new appointments to its Artistic and Creative Engagement team, who will jointly focus on expanding the reach of the organisation's many creative engagement activities and programmes, including Class Act, Breakthrough Writers, and Creating Space. These key strategic appointments seek to connect the art we, our collaborators and our partners create, with our communities and our potential audience, and to provide the platforms and tools to help people create and participate in culture.

Mahri Reilly, who joins the Traverse today from her position as Creative Director of Scottish Youth Theatre, takes the role of Creative Engagement Producer, with oversight of all creative engagement strands. Class Act activities will be led by Robbie Gordon as Creative Producer - Class Act, supported by Jennifer Galt as Class Act Producing Assistant, as the project moves into an exciting new phase nationally, and internationally - with further details to follow soon.

ABOUT THE TEAM

Mahri Reilly, Creative Engagement Producer

Mahri Reilly joins the Traverse from Scottish Youth Theatre, where she was Creative Director, leading the company's national artistic and digital programme, in collaboration with young artists across intersections and geographies, supporting their bespoke artistic development journeys. Prior to this she was Head of Learning and Participation at Ovalhouse Theatre in South London, leading their creative learning department and associated cross-generation programmes in preparation for the organisation's move to Brixton House.

Previously an embedded member of the Learn Team at National Theatre of Scotland for 3 years, Mahri worked across scale and community to share and tell stories as the then Learn Project Manager, as well as taking the role of Associate Producer for year 2 of the Theatre in Schools Scotland pilot. As well as being based in theatre venues and theatre companies, Mahri has worked extensively across grassroots arts organisations, festivals and street theatre companies as a freelance practitioner, establishing accessible creative engagement participation opportunities and taking stories that connect to our universal humanity to new audiences far and wide.

Robbie Gordon, Creative Producer - Class Act

Robbie Gordon was previously one of the Traverse's Artists in Residence, working as Creative Development Producer. He is a theatre-maker and co-founder of Wonder Fools, and previously worked as the Creative Engagement Director at the Gaiety Theatre, and the director of the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland Young Company.

Jennifer is a producer and theatre-maker who joins Team Traverse from Framework Theatre Company, where she works as Company Producer. She has previously worked with Scottish Youth Theatre and Just Add Milk Productions as Assistant Producer.

Led by acclaimed playwright Mariem Omari, and with support from Traverse Associate director Shilpa T-Hyland, over 10 weeks the group will be guided through online and in-person sessions covering the playwriting process, industry mentorship, and feedback on their writing. They will meet with established writers and artists, including guest facilitators Tawona Sithole, Apphia Campbell and Hannah Lavery.

At the culmination of the course, participants will have an opportunity to hear an extract of their writing read by actors, as well as receiving a bespoke one to one meeting with the Traverse Team.

Developed to identify the most exciting voices writing in the UK & Ireland, Breakthrough Writers: In Residence invited writers over the age of 18 at any stage of their career, currently living in the UK and Ireland, to submit an anonymised, full-length stage script to the Traverse.

We are very pleased to now announce the five writers who have been selected to receive six months of bespoke mentoring and dramaturgical development from the Traverse Team, including Artistic Director Gareth Nicholls, Associate Directors Katherine Nesbitt and Shilpa T-Hyland, and other associated artists, to each develop a full-length play - culminating in readings of each, in their entirety.
